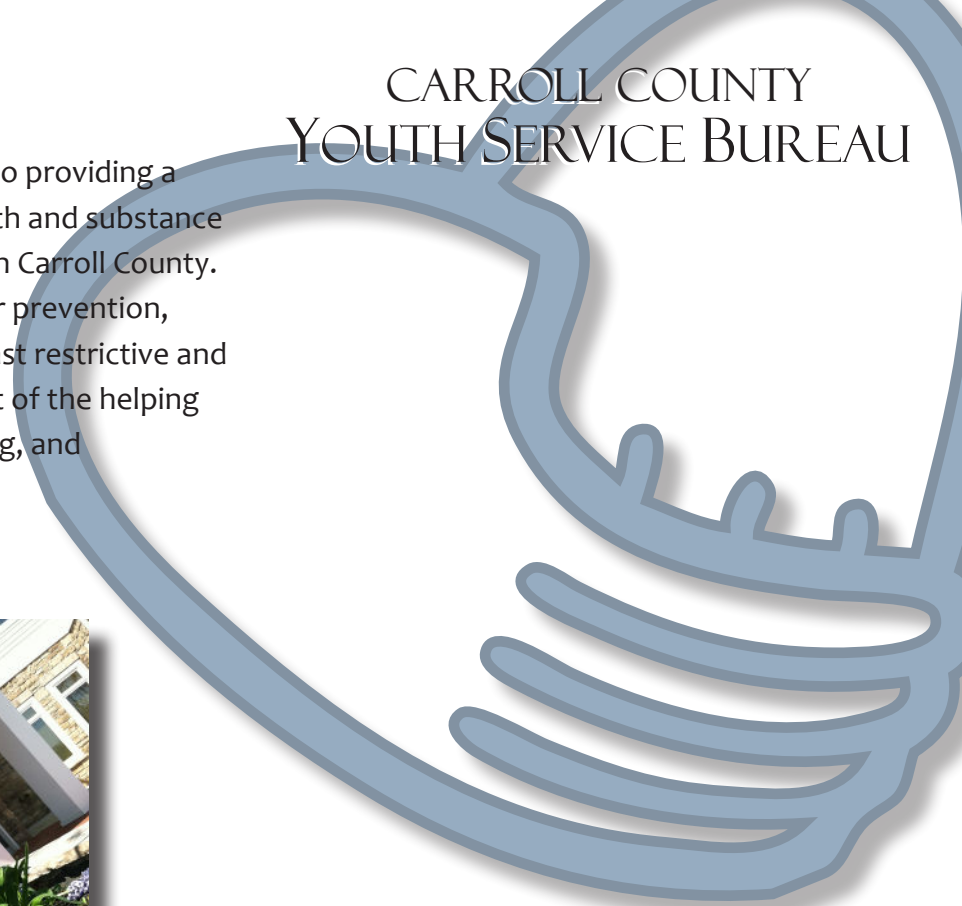

CCYSB'S Mobile Treatment PROGRAM

your health... your space... your way.

The Mobile Treatment Team utilizes a service-delivery model that provides comprehensive recovery-oriented treatment to people with severe and persistent mental illnesses. It is comprised of a multi-disciplinary mental health and support staff, whose primary functions are to provide nursing, therapy, case management, and medication management services to individuals to assist them in successful community living.

Mobile Treatment works with individuals for whom traditional treatment provided by community mental health outpatient services has not successfully met their needs. Mobile Treatment interventions (e.g., treatment and rehabilitative services) take place in community locations. This includes the client's residence, place of employment, and, at times, shelters, jails, and hospitals.



Referral Guidelines

Individuals, who are being considered for the Mobile Treatment Program, will be screened for the following admission criteria:

- Carroll County residents, who are 18 years or older and have severe and persistent mental illness causing symptoms and impairments, which produce distress and major disabilities in adult function (e.g., employment, self-care, and social and interpersonal relationships).
- Severe and persistent mental health diagnosis
- Limited understanding of their need for help and difficulty getting to appointments on their own because of mental illness.
- Multiple hospitalizations and/or emergency room visits in the past year, or incarcerations, as a result of psychiatric illness.
- Indication of a willingness to accept Mobile Treatment involvement.
